Transplants are seedlings that are lifted from a seedling bed and replanted in a larger bed to allow more root and branch growth before lifted again for shipment. Example a 2-2 transplant is a 4yr. old tree that spent 2yrs in a seedling bed and 2yrs in a transplant bed. If you see a P+1 or P+2 the "P" means the tree was started in a container the number following indicates years spent in a transplant bed

Tree Descriptions

American Cranberry (*Viburnum trilobum*) Grows 8 to 10' tall and spreads 8-10' wide. Produces clusters of white flowers in May producing clusters of brilliant red fruit which persists into winter. A favorite of birds and other wildlife. Grows best in well drained moist soil, likes damp thickets, low woods and swamps. Hardy to Zone 3.

American Larch (*Larix laricina*) fast growth reaching 90 feet. A deciduous conifer that is native on wet soils, prefers full sun, does well on upland soils. Soft needles turn a golden yellow in the fall. Hardy to zone 1. Has an open pyramidal shape and pendulous branches. Prefers moist sites, but will grow in many soil types and conditions. Bright green leaf like needles appear in spring, turn yellow in autumn and fall off.

Balsam Fir (*Abies balsamea*): A NY native, dense short soft dark green needles, likes cool- moist well-drained soil, avoid heavy wet clay, Great Christmas tree and aroma.

Black Cherry (*Prunus serotina*) reach 80' tall- fast growth in many soil types prefers full sun. White flower spikes appear in early spring and produces small reddish black berries in summer.

Blueberry, Blue Ray, Medium size fruit with a high sugar content. Plants yield heavily. Grows 5-6'tall. Fruits ripen in mid-season, Self-pollinating, but will yield larger crops if pollinated with other variety Jersey. Plant 4-8' apart likes acidic soil, full sun and resistant to drought

Blueberry, Jersey A cold hardy, healthy blueberry. Abundant crops of large, crack-resistant, light blue berries ripen in August. Self-pollinating, but will yield larger crops if pollinated with another variety like Blue Ray. Plant 4-8' apart likes acidic soil, full sun and resistant to drought.

Burr Oak: (*Quercus macrocarpa*) is a large, drought-tolerant tree native to North America, known for its deeply lobed leaves and distinctive acorns with bur-like caps. It thrives in a range of soil types and conditions, offering critical habitat for wildlife, especially birds and mammals. Its robust roots also help with soil stabilization and erosion control.

Colorado Blue Spruce (*Picea pungens*): 100' tall, stiff silvery-blue needles likes well drained moist soil and full sun, avoid wet heavy clay areas, great Christmas tree.

Common Purple Lilac (*Syringa vulgaris*): 8-12' upright multi-stemmed shrub, beautiful fragrant purple flower spike in May. Grows well in most soils.

Concolor Fir (*Abies concolor*): reaches 120' tall, soft fleshy, silvery-green needles, grows best in full sun, well drained soils, avoid heavy wet clay, great Christmas tree due to needle retention.

Douglas Fir (*Pseudotsuga menziesii*): reaches 200' tall, Soft blue green needles, full sun, moist well-drained soils, avoid heavy wet clay. Great Christmas tree due to needle retention.

Daylily – Stella De Oro: blooms yellow trumpet-shaped flowers. Grows 20" tall, spreads 30". Perennial, does best in full sun, partial shade. Adaptable to dry and moist soils.

Daylily - Dream Baby: Perennial 18" tall Attractive 3-4" apricot ruffled flowers with reddish-purple eye zone. Extended day bloomer early through mid-summer. Full sun or partial shade.

Daylily - Frances Fay: Perennial, flowering anytime from mid-spring to very early summer, each doesn't last more than one day. It will rebloom several weeks later. Color is light yellow but with a distinctive touch of pale pinkish peach. Full to partial sun and average soil with good drainage.

Daylily-Pink Damask: (*Hemerocallis spp.*) Perennial, with striking pink flowers and yellow throats. It thrives in various climates and soil types, offering benefits like drought tolerance, pollinator attraction, and soil erosion prevention.

Eastern White Pine (*Pinus Strobus*) Fast growth, 130' tall, soft blue-green evergreen needles 2-3" long, very hearty, grows well in most soil types and conditions. Christmas trees- wind breaks.

Hazelnut, American (*Corylus americana*) Also known as American Filbert medium to fast growth rate. A multi-stemmed small tree growing 10 to 15 feet high, dark green summer foliage turns yellow in fall. Edible nuts mature September to October. Prefers well drained soils. Hardy to zone 4.

Hosta (*Ventricosa*) produces wide oval, variegated leaves are dark green with irregular white margins. Easily grown in moist, rich, well-drained soils in part shade to full shade.

Hybrid poplar (*Populus deltoides* x *Populus nigra*) A very fast-growing tree, up to 5 to 8 feet per year. Has silvery-green ovate leaves and broad shade-tree shape. Usually planted for very fast shade. This is a cottonless hybrid. Plant back from sidewalks. Grows up to 50', 30'spread Grows well in many soil types and conditions likes full sun.

Iris, blue king and Snow Queen: Both grow best in moist to well-drained soil in full sun or partial shade. Has beautiful, violet blue or bright white 3" – 4" blooms. Upright, tall grass like foliage grows to 30" – 36". Blooms in late spring and is easy to grow, growing wider every year, creating more foliage and more flowers.

Liatris Spicata: also known as Dense Blazing Star or Marsh Blazing Star. A tall, upright, clump-forming perennial native to moist low grounds, meadows and marsh margins. Typically grows 2-4' tall in cultivation. Features terminal spikes (6-12" long) of sessile, rounded, fluffy, deep purple flower heads (each to 3/4" across) appearing atop rigid, erect, leafy flower stalks. Blooms in summer.

Ninebark (*Physocarpus opulifolius*) A deciduous shrub zone 2, 5-9' spreading shrub. May-June it has white flowers and in mid-September is has a red fruit. It has a beautiful exfoliating bark. Ninebark tolerates full sun, dry conditions and many soil types.

Norway Spruce (*Picea abies*): 150' tall fast growing, will reach 6' in 6-7yrs with a 3yr seedling. A dense, dark green needle, very hearty, grows well in most soil types and conditions.

Pachysandra (*Procumbens*): –evergreen ground cover with uniform height of 6 inches, small white flowers in the spring, good for banks, full sun or shade hardy in most soil types, plant 6" apart

Raspberry (*Rubus idaeus*) is a versatile shrub known for its sweet, red or black berries. It thrives in well-drained soil with plenty of sunlight, often used in gardens for both its fruit and its ability to attract pollinators. Raspberry plants also improve soil structure with their deep root systems and can help prevent erosion in garden beds.

Red Bud, eastern (*Cercis canadensis*) A large shrub growing to 20'. Prefers well drained soils. Produces bright pink flowers in early spring. Leaves are large and smooth, dark green and heart shaped.

Red Maple (*Acer rubrum*) medium-sized, hardwood, reaching 50 ft. Crown is small, dense and narrow. Bark is smooth and light gray; with patches of long scaly plates. Leaves are 2 to 4 inches long with 3 to 5 palmate lobes and serrated margins. Brilliant red fall color. A very hardy tree, grows on a wide range of soil types and conditions.

Red Osier Dogwood: (*Cornus stolonifera*) Grows 7-9' tall and wide. A slender, upright shrub. It has a red stem and white drupe fruit in mid-August. Grows best in moist soils but will tolerate wet or swampy conditions. It is also a great structure for holding soil on sloped areas.

Red Oak (*Quercus rubra*): 60' high, 40' wide, fast-growing oak, Large deeply lobed leaves, prefers loamy slightly acidic soils. Food for wildlife, timber trees, great fall color.

Red Pine (*Pinus resinosa*) A tall, coniferous tree native to North America, known for its long, slender needles and reddish-brown bark. It thrives in well-drained, sandy soils and is valued for its fast growth and strong wood. Red pines also provide important habitat for wildlife and help stabilize soil with their extensive root systems.

Sawtooth Oak (*Quercus acutissima*): reach 50'with broad spreading branches, will produce 1-inch acorns in 7 - 8 years -favorite of turkey, squirrel and deer, and prefers well drained soil and full sun. Leaves resemble that of a chestnut.

Silver Maple (*Acer saccharinum*) A fast growing medium to large tree reaching 60 feet with spreading branches. Softest wood of all the maples. Leaves are 3 to 6 inches long with 5 lobes and turn yellow in fall. Grows best in well drained soils. Hardy to zone 3.

Strawberry (*Fragaria ananassa*) is a low-growing perennial prized for its sweet, red berries. It thrives in well-drained soil with full sun and is often grown in gardens or containers. Besides providing delicious fruit, strawberry plants attract pollinators and help reduce soil erosion with their spreading root systems.

Sugar Maple (*Acer saccharum*) Grows up to 75 feet tall. Offers good shade in summer and brilliant scarlet-orange color in the fall. A nice ornamental tree and also provides maple sugar products. Thrives in well-drained soil. Likes full sun but will tolerate some shade. An important timber tree for wood products.

Sycamore (*Acer pseudo-platanus*) Grows fast & will reach 100'. Leaves are large and resemble the maple tree. Mature bark takes on a camouflage effect. Grows in many soil types and full sun.

Swamp White Oak (*Quercus bicolor*) Grows up to 60 feet tall. Grows well in wet swampy conditions and many other soil types and conditions. Will grow where many other oaks will not. Leaves have shallow lobes and turn yellow-bronze in the fall. Acorns are a favorite of many wildlife. Hardy from zones 4-8.

Tulip Poplar (*Liriodendron tulipifera*) Also known as Yellow Poplar. Grows to 150 tall with fast growth in sheltered areas. Foliage is 3 to 8 inches and bright green, turning golden yellow in the fall. Flowers bloom in mid-June. They are 2 to 3 inches long and are bright yellowish green, resembling a tulip. Prefers full sun and well drained moist acidic soils.

White Birch -Native (*Betula papyrifera*) Also known as canoe birch or paper birch, hardy to zone 2. Can reach 70 feet tall. Grows best in cool moist locations in a variety of soil types including wetter sites. Likes full sun or partial shade. Bark turns white in 4 to 6 years. Plant 3 to 5 trees together to create a clump effect. Open green foliage turns bright yellow in the fall.

White Flowering Dogwood (*Cornus florida*) –Growth to 40 feet. Dense green foliage turns bright scarlet in fall, clusters of white flowers bloom in late May giving way to bright red berries in the fall, Prefers moist rich well drained soils and full or half day sun.

White Oak (*Fagaceae Quercus alba*): A very large tree; when open grown, white oaks have rugged, irregular crowns that are wide spreading, with a stocky bole. In the forest crowns are upright and oval with trees reaching up to 100 feet tall and several feet in diameter.

White Cedar (*Thuja occidentalis*) Also known as Arborvitae. Grows to 60 feet tall. Evergreen foliage is scale-like and flat. Grows well in many soil types and conditions. Likes full sun or 1/2-day sun. These trees grow in a pyramidal shape and are well suited for screens and windbreaks planted 6 feet apart.
